Senator Crapo (R-ID) Will Co-Sponsor SBP/DIC Legislation

Senator Mike Crapo (R-ID) has decided to co-sponsor S. 734, which would repeal the SBP/DIC offset. This was announced by his aide, Sierra

Forbes, at the American Legion in Post Falls on 8 August. Under current law, the surviving spouse of an active or retired service member who dies from a service-caused condition is entitled to \$1,233 per month in Dependency and Indemnity Compensation (DIC) from the VA. If a military retiree also chose to enroll in the Survivor Benefit Program (SBP), DIC is deducted from the surviving spouse's SBP annuity. S.734 would repeal this offset.

July we ate at Twigs in the Valley in their private room and it was the best service we have ever had and the food was very good. Our waitness, Bev, refilled coffee cups and brought the tea drinkers fresh hot pots of water without interrupting us, and then she even contributed cash to our collection for socks for the Homeless Veterans Program. In August we went back to Coeur d'Alene, for our first visit to the Beachouse and ended up having a private room. The staff there was great and the food was good.

On 2 September we are trying something different, picnicking in Corbin Park, Spokane, and ordering our box lunches from Christ Kitchen. Shirley volunteered to bring some folding tables and we each will bring our own chair. Kay White is our hostess; you can make your reservation and meal selection by calling her 509-315-9684. It will be fun, so plan to end the summer with us!

Our widows and wives are a cut above and I am so proud to be the leader of this great group of women. So far this year we have donated 786 items to the Homeless Veterans Program; 643 items

to the Spokane Veterans Home; \$230 to the Food Bank; and ordered 40 wreaths from Wreaths Across America for the Washington State Veterans Cemetery here in Spokane County. The wreaths will be placed on Satur-



day, 13 December at noon. All are welcome to attend and place a wreath or two.

Theresa Hart of **NEWBY-GINNINGS**Guest Speaker for 21 September Social



There's a new service for veterans, active duty personnel and Gold Star families in the Coeur d'Alene area called **NEWBY-GINNINGS**. It was established last year by Theresa Hart in honor of her son, SPC Nicholas Newby, who was killed in action in Baghdad Iraq on 7 July 2011.

NEWBY-GINNINGS MISSION

HUMBLE SUPPORT AND STEADFAST HONOR TO THOSE WHO SERVED AND SACRIFICED

NEWBY-GINNINGS provides basic necessities and essential household items FREE of CHARGE to veterans, active military, and their families, as well as Gold Star families at absolutely no cost to them. It is a 501c(3) tax-exempt charitable organization.

Theresa accepts donations from the public and passes them on veterans who visit her facility. She needs furniture, cookware, dishes, silverware, bedding, towels, clothing and shoes, unopened personal hygiene items, kitchen appliances, large appliances, TVs. DVD players, radios, mattresses and mobility items such as walkers, wheelchairs and canes. Right now, she especially needs chests of drawers. She could also use dressy men's clothing that can be worn to job interviews.

There are NO income eligibility requirements and one does not have to prove need. All that is required is proof of military service, either past or present, for oneself or an associated family member.

A classic example of those Theresa has recently helped include homeless veterans who are provided housing by Goodwill Industries through their Supportive Services for Veterans Families (SSVF) program. Goodwill gives them a place to live, a mattress and whatever is in their backpack. They may choose whatever they need from **NEWBY-GINNINGS** to furnish their new living space.



Another example: recently, when Theresa arrived at the shop at 0700, a 70 year-old veteran was sitting outside in his vehicle. He was homeless, so she referred him to Goodwill who took him into their SSVF program. By that night, he had housing, a new queen size mattress and a backpack. He later came to **NEWBY-GINNINGS** and received free of charge everything else he needed to furnish his apartment.

Theresa specifically asks that we <u>NOT</u> bring any donations to the September social, but rather, deliver them directly to <u>NEWBY-GINNINGS</u> at 147 E. Aqua Circle, Unit 2, Dalton Gardens ID 83815 (you'll think you're in Coeur d'Alene). This is your golden opportunity to clean out and downsize!

Directions: From I-90, take Exit 12 in Idaho (Hwy. 95) and go north about three miles to Prairie Ave. Turn right and go .2 mile to Government Way. Turn right on Government Way and take your first left, which is Aqua Circle. It's the second building on the left. It sits back from the street and has a beautiful maroon awning with bold white letters that say

NEWBY-GINNINGS.

This venture is providing Theresa with pride and purpose. She is taking the strength she didn't know she had and turning it into a new beginning. Please join us on 21 September at the Highlands Golf Course Grill and Tap House to learn how you can help her provide basic necessities, comfort items, dignity and respect for veterans.

If you register correctly, your information will be filled in for you and all you have to do is hit "send." Please, everyone sign up for this wonderful service. Better yet, run for elected office. We need more veterans and military spouses in Congress and our state legislatures.

My closing remark is this – I'm tickled to see a friend of mine, Joyce Harte, on the slate of candidates for the MOAA Board of Directors. I served with her during my last year on the Auxiliary Member Advisory Committee and her first year. She would do a fine job on the board for all of us.



The new MOAA *Remarriage Guide* is filled with lots of information. Go to the MOAA homepage, www.moaa.org, click on *Publications* and then *Books and Guides*. Scroll down to *Remarriage Guide*. You can download it for free if you're a Premium (annual) or Life member. Some of the highlights include:

- SBP/DIC, CHAMPVA, Social Security
- TRICARE and TRICARE for Life as well as commissary and exchange privileges
- Space-available ("Space A") travel on military aircraft
- Dependents' Educational Assistance (DEA)
- VA Home Loans
- Death Pensions for surviving spouses with dependent children
- Surviving spouse who is a patient in a nursing home, in need of the regular aid and attendance of another person, or permanently housebound



MOAA also has a **Survivors** button at the bottom of their homepage. Click on that and you will see a publication for planning ahead in the event of your demise, as well as booklets for surviving spouses.
